

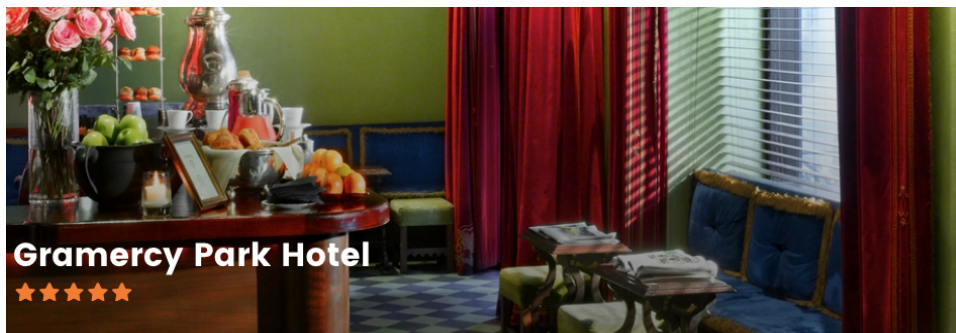
9 Hotels With Cocktail Bars You Shouldn't Miss

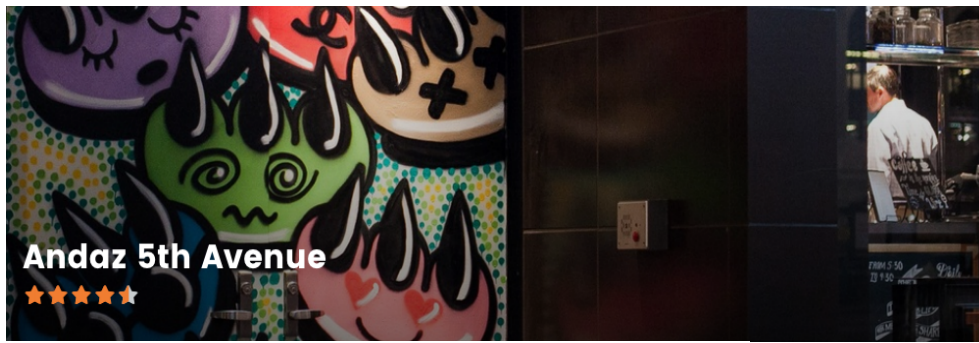
WHY IT MADE THE LIST

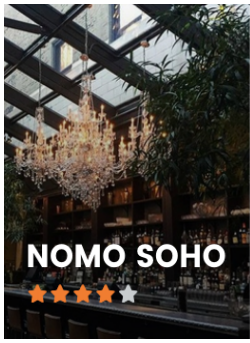

The lobby lounge is an elegant space for drinks and Central Park views, while MObar, on the 35th floor, is a more intimate cocktail destination.

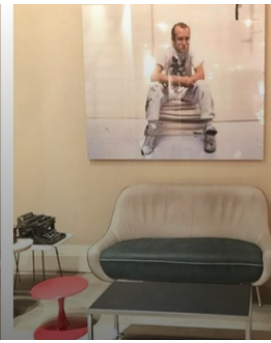


NOMO SOHO
